Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to all of you. May 2025 be filled with happiness and good fortune!



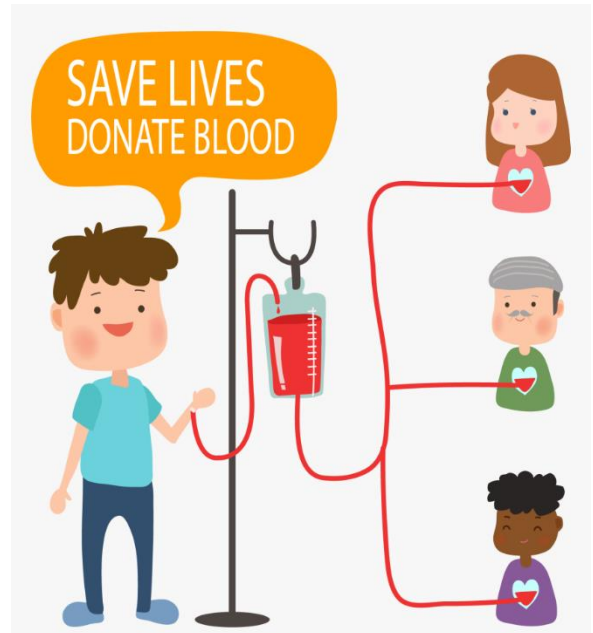
**NOV 2024 Blood Drive

On November 18th, the Sons of the American Legion and the American Red Cross sponsored a blood drive at Post 60. Since we joined forces with the Red Cross, to date, we have now sponsored 12 Blood Drives. Our efforts have been supported by 409 total donors, and have collected 371 units of blood, averaging 31 units per drive. On November 18th, 33 donors helped us collect an additional 27 units of blood.

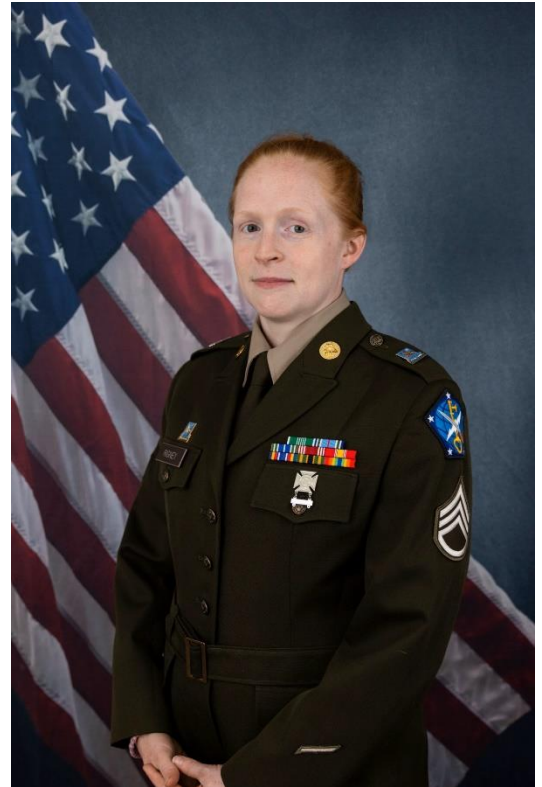

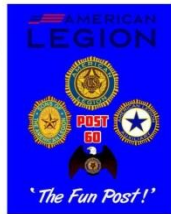
