There was a kindness about her in that she shared everything except her lunch.

They had their own Special Olympics at the school. Every Special Needs student could participate, including ones in wheelchairs. It was a joyous time that the students looked forward to participating in.

As the race started the teachers and students cheered them on as the participants waved and smiled at the crowd. It was not long before one of the students in braces fell and started to weep. Helen stopped running and kneeled by her classmate's side, stroking the teenager's hair to try and comfort the student on the ground. She kept saying to her friend that they were going to be okay. She then helped the student up and held their hand. Other students saw what Helen was doing and joined in holding hands as they crossed the finish line together.

Helen did not come in first in that race. That did not matter to her. She won the hearts of all those who saw her. Helen showed leadership with her compassion toward her classmate, just as Post 60 leads the way with their generous contributions to the Special Olympics.




