At our next general membership meeting on May 11th, we will be holding elections for the 26/27 year. Please note that all members at the May meeting must have their 2026 membership card with them.

National Poppy Day, May 22nd, 2026

The Flanders Field Poppy, is a significant symbol of remembrance. It is inspired by the vivid red poppies that grew on the battlefields of Belgium and France following World War I. It is a recognized symbol in the U.S. for those who have served since World War I to honor those who served and died for our country in all wars. It reminds Americans of the sacrifices made by our veterans while protecting our freedoms. The American Legion Auxiliary is going above and beyond to engage our community and bring awareness to the meaning of the poppy:

On Saturday May 9th, 7:00 - 9:30 pm: Unit 60 and friends will begin to dance the night away in support of the 5K (7,000 steps) virtual, 2026 program. On Friday, May 22nd, wear a red poppy to honor the fallen and support the living who have worn our nation's uniform. Unit 60 Auxiliary will be present at Mission BBQ (Laurel) on May 22nd at 11:30 am to distribute poppies and express appreciation to each veteran who visits.

Fill the wreath (entire month of May): Pick a poppy and in memory of a friend or loved one, write their name on the tag and attach it to the poppy wreath. Wreath is located at the post entrance.

Heart Wreath: Auxiliary members have created a poppy and light Heart Wreath to display at the post, raising awareness of the poppy program and its meaning.

Our fun continues into the summer with the ALA version of Bar Bingo every Wednesday evening starting after Memorial Day. The ALA Convention in Ocean City is set for July 14th through the 17th. Delegates will be voted on at the June General Membership meeting.
