November 10, 1775 - The U.S. Marine Corps was established as part of the U.S. Navy. It became a separate unit on July 11, 1789. He has completed three tours abroad defending the freedoms we believe are essential to this Republic and to all those aspiring to everything we believe in. **Semper Fi!** And to all veterans of Post 60 who were members of the Corps, we especially thank you for your service on your birthday!

November 11, 1918 - At 5:45 a.m., in Marshal Foch's railway car in the Forest of Compiegne, the Armistice between the Allied and Central Powers was signed, silencing the guns of World War I effective at 11 a.m. – the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. In many places in Europe, a moment of silence in memory of the millions of fallen soldiers is still observed. In America, we call it **Veterans Day**. We thank all our military personnel who have served in defending freedom around the globe in all conflicts!



CJ Thomas Detachment of Maryland Junior Shooting Sports Champion Squadron 60 Member

Charles Junior (CJ) Thomas, a 16-year-old Junior at Reservoir High School, and a two-year member of Squadron 60, capped off an amazing run and wrapped up the Detachment of Maryland Junior Shooting Sports Championships at the AL Southern MD Youth Camp, defeating 23 other competitors.

Why amazing? Possibly unbelievable? CJ had no experience with air guns or firearms prior to entering the annual Junior Shooting Sports contest. CJ expressed interest after he and his family were approached by Joe Lohman, Commander, Detachment of Maryland, about CJ entering the annual contest. Laurel American Legion Post 60 had never fielded an entry and Commander Lohman felt CJ was the person to start with. Though a little nervous, CJ was eager to give it a try. He never dreamed he would do so well, let alone sweep the entire three-round tournament.

Drawing on strong military bloodlines on both sides of his family, CJ began to prepare for the contest with his father Tim, a Desert Storm veteran. CJ completed the prerequisite Safety courses and began honing his skills. Come tournament time he was ready.

In April, he won the first-round outscoring ten other competitors. In May, he increased his lead in the competition, winning the round handily.

On September 30th in the Finals, CJ squared off against 22 other competitors, defeating them and winning first prize, a Nintendo Switch System.

Laurel Post 60 is extremely proud of CJ and his accomplishments. Post 60's Commander Lee Luby presented a plaque to him at the Early Bird Social to recognize his achievements. CJ is excited about Post 60 possibly starting up its own shooting team and being a part of it.

Post 60 would like to use CJ as the foundation in building a Junior Shooting Sports program. Red Cross Blood Drive coming to Post 60 on

November 20th, 2023

The American Red Cross needs our help. Since the beginning of 2020, many thousands of blood drives have been cancelled. **Blood Drives are essential and** are in direct support to the emergency services remaining open to sustain the continuing fight against chronic illnesses and diseases.

Per the American Red Cross, "we understand public health concerns, but want to stress that donating blood is a safe process and Red Cross blood drives have the highest safety standards. Here are just a few of the vigilant measures to protect the health of all involved in our blood drives".

- 1) Donor and Staff temperature check before entering the hall.
- 2) Only Donors will be allowed entry into the building, families must remain outside.
- 3) Spacing of beds a minimum of 6' apart.
- 4) Using sterile collection sets.
- 5) Staff using Aseptic Scrubs on Arms.
- 6) Wiping down all donor touched areas.
- 7) Having Hand Sanitizer available.


