Flag retirement at Post 60

Post 60 wrapped up our flag retirement activity for the year in late August. Charlie Turner, Squadron 60's Sgt at Arms is also in charge of coordinating flag purchases and scheduling flag retirement events (normally around 3 to 4 per year) coordinating the events with assistance from several post members. From late-March through August we retired over 1,000 American flags. The key phrase is "retired" While destroying an unserviceable flag by fire is acceptable, it's not a "flag burning" event. If you have a flag that is unserviceable (torn, faded, etc.) you can place it in the mailbox in front of the post. In addition, please see Charlie to receive a replacement, at no charge.

What is a Quilt of Valor?

A Quilt of Valor® (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation." To use the term Quilt of Valor, Quilts of Valor or QOV, the quilt must be a specific size, must have a label with required information, it must be awarded (it is not a gift) and it must be recorded.
