First Vice Commander Shirley Luby, Resource Officer David Privott, and I were extremely honored to attend this event and assist in the raising of the POW/MIA flag.

As they were escorted into the building, they couldn’t help admiring the many prizes displayed for their bingo games. Before we started all the fun activities they enjoyed a fantastic lunch of steak, fish, baked potatoes, green
