The Resource Officer at American Legion Post 60 is available to help members, veterans, their families, and others who may need assistance navigating the many resources and benefits available through The American Legion and the community.

Whether you have a question about veterans' benefits or simply don't know where to turn for assistance, the Resource Officer can help point you in the right direction.

How I Can Help

Your Post 60 Resource Officer can assist with information and guidance concerning:

- VA benefits and claims: General information about VA compensation, pension, healthcare, and other benefits.
- Veterans Service Officer (VSO) resources: Assistance connecting veterans with accredited representatives who can provide help with VA claims and appeals.
- Healthcare resources: Information on VA healthcare and available community resources.
- Education benefits: Guidance on available education and training resources for veterans and eligible family members.
- Employment assistance: Information about veteran employment programs, job resources, and career assistance.
- Housing and financial resources: Help identify available community, state, and federal assistance programs.
- Military records and documentation: Information on obtaining military records and other documents that may be needed for benefits.
- Emergency and community assistance: Help connect veterans and families with organizations that may be able to aid during difficult times.
- American Legion programs and services: Information about programs available through the American Legion and Post 60.

- Referrals and resources: If we don't have the answer, we'll help you find the person or organization that does.

The SAL membership cards have arrived for 2027. We are thrilled to share that our membership renewal performance is currently higher than last year. Your continued commitment allows us to expand our mission and reach new heights in 2027.

Regular members will continue to receive \$5 off the general membership rate until September 3rd, 2026. Make sure you renew today to ensure you receive the discount.

A Hot day could not stop this year's Car Show as a large display overcame difficult conditions. Ninety-six vehicles took part in the event, creating a substantial display for automotive fans. The ninety-two cars formed the main part of the show, while the four bikes added another point of interest for visitors.

A lineup of this size gives guests more chances to compare vehicles, take photos, and start conversations. It also gives organizers a strong base for judging, display planning, and community activities when those features are part of the event.

Bringing a vehicle to a show takes planning before the event even begins. Owners must prepare their vehicles, arrange transportation, and spend time presenting them in good condition. Completing those tasks in hot, humid weather shows a prominent level of commitment. The weather affected how spectators enjoyed the show. Most chose to spend their time in air-conditioned areas rather than remain outside for extended periods. That choice reduced the flow of people around the outdoor display, especially during the warmest parts of the day.

Our heartfelt thanks go to the volunteers who planned, prepared, welcomed guests, supported fundraising, and stayed through cleanup. Your teamwork created a respectful and welcoming event for veterans, families, and neighbors.

We also thank DJ Butch for providing music, equipment, announcements, and a wonderful spirit of support. Your contribution helped bring people.

together and made the gathering memorable. We appreciate every partner who gave us time, space, supplies, or funds, and we look forward to continuing this support for veterans and our local community

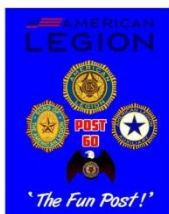

LARS supports the Laurel Community and many of the people they serve are veterans and their families. It is one of Post 60's ongoing projects to support LARS, there is a food collection bin set up in our lounge. LARS will accept anything that is non-perishable, but they are always in need of peanut butter & jelly, tuna, pasta & sauce, cereal, and oatmeal.
